

## Infrastructure in Mexico: US\$3 Billion Public Private Partnership Projects Plan Unveiled

On March 9, 2017, the Mexican government announced the highly anticipated Mexican Public Private Partnership Projects Plan (the "Plan") for the construction, rehabilitation, operation and maintenance of several infrastructure projects in the country, with an overall estimated investment of US\$3 billion.

The Plan will be developed in two phases and covers a vast array of sectors, including roads, toll roads, hospitals, water treatment facilities and prisons.

The first phase of the Plan includes the following projects, which have an estimated investment of US\$1.1 billion and are expected to be tendered by the relevant Mexican Federal agencies in the next few days:

The second phase of the Plan is expected to be launched at the end of the second quarter of 2017 and will include 18 projects with an estimated investment of US\$1.9 billion.
